BASTARDY ORDER OF 19TH AUGUST 1831

Bastardy Order of 19.8.1831 against William Joscelyne by a Maria Ketley, single-woman.

Essex, to wit, The Order of Sir John Tyrells Baronet and John Crabb, Esquire two off his Majesty's Justices of the Peace, acting in and for the said County.

Whereas it hath been duly made appear unto us, the said Justices, as well upon the Complaint of the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish off Little Waltham in the said County, as upon the Oath of Maria Ketley Single-Woman, that she was delivered of a Male Bastard Child, at the said Parish, on the 21st Day of July last and that the said Bastard Child is now living, and chargeable to the same. And further, that William Joscelyne late of Springfield in the said County Laborer did beget the said Bastard Child on the Body of her the said Maria Ketley And whereas the said William Joscelyne hath appeared before us, in Pursuance of a Summons for the Purpose, but hath not showed any Cause why he should not be adjudges the reputed Father of the said Bastard Child.

We do, therefore, upon the Examination of the Cause and Circumstances of the Premises, hereby adjudge him, the said William Joscelyne to be the reputed Father of the said Bastard Child; and Order, that he do pay to the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish of Little Waltham the Sum of Three pounds one shilling and sixpence for the Charges incident to the Birth of the said Child, and the Maintenance thereof, to the Time of making this our Order, viz.:-

And we do further Order, that the said William Joscelyne shall also pay to the Churchwardens and Overseers of the said Parish of Little Waltham for the Time being, the Sum of Two Shillings Weekly, for and towards the Keeping, Sustentation, and Maintenance of the said Bastard Child, for so long Time as the said Bastard Child shall be chargeable to the said Parish. And that the said Maria Ketley shall also, in like manner, pay the Sum of Sixpence Weekly, in case she shall not nurse and take Care of the Child herself. The said several Sums being duly and respectively ascertained on Oath, before us, pursuant to the Statutes in such Case made and provided.

Given under our Hands and Seals, the 19th Day of August in the Year of our Lord, 1831.

2. A Removal Order was made to take Susannah Joslyn back to her husband William Joslyn in Great Leighes from Black Notley. Evidence was taken from William. 21.7.1815. ERO D/P 137/13/2
3. Martha Joslen, widow, ventured from Great Baddow to Great Burstead without legal settlement. She was unable to attend the Petty Sessions "owing to illness and infirmity". But received a Removal Order. 23.11.1820. ERO D/P 139/13/2
4. A Removal Order was served on Mary Joslen. She was unable to travel because of sickness and infirmity of body and the Order was suspended on 23.11.1820. APPRENTICES INDENTURE

1. An Indenture of 25.7.1744 re Mary Gosling "about 7 yrs of age a poor Child lately left to the Charge of the said Parish", describes her apprenticeship to Robert Barnes of the Hamlet of Moulsham and Parish of Chelmsford to learn "Housewifry". The Apprentice was to "Dwell, and Serve"and Obey in all lawful Business and Employment, according to the best of her Power, Ability and Knowledge, and honestly and orderly, shall demean and behave herself...."until such time as she.... "Come to the Age of One and Twenty Years" In return to be given "Meat, Drink, Apparel, Washing, Lodging, and all other Necessaries during the said Term". ERO D/P 94/14/2
2. An indenture of 4.11.1791 about "Abraham Starling a poor child of the said Parish" was given as " Apprentice to John Josling of Braintree, Pastry Cook". ERO D/P 94/14/2.

THE TIMES CD ROM INDEX.

1. William Joscelyne, of Bishopgate Street, London, was a grocer declared bankrupt at the Bankrupt's Court, Basinghall Street, after hearings on July 20th, 31st and August 24th 1827. The solicitor was Mr. Allingham, Hatton Garden. The Times. 14th July 1827.
2. Joscelyne. Court of Bankruptcy, August 12th 1873. Ex parte Joscelyne re Powis. Held before Mr. Register Spring-Rice. Reported in the Times of August 13th 1873.
3. George Edward Joscelyne of Wolverley and Kidderminster, auctioneer, was named in a report under "Bankrupts" in the Times of 11th August 1880 regarding the "Notice of Adjudication and First Meetings of Creditors appearing in the Country".
4. John Joscelyne. A report in the Times of 2nd September 1875.

At WORSHIP STREET, JOHN JOSCELYNE and JOHN MILLER, scavengers in the employment of the North Metropolitan Tramways Company, were summoned by the Vestry of the parish of St. Leonard, Shoreditch, for throwing mud in the carriage-way. Mr. Enoch Walker, clerk to the Vestry, prosecuted, and Mr. Godfrey defended on behalf of the company. He said that the defendants, who were only nominally the offenders, would plead guilty; but on behalf of the company he wished it to be understood that the matter complained of was really unintentional. Mr. Walker explained that the men were sent out to clear the mud from the grooves of the tramrails, and then it was thrown into the road and left an eyesore and a nuisance to the public. The matter had some time ago been tried in this court and the company fined. Mr. Cooke now ordered the defendants to pay fines of £5 each on the first summonses against them, the second summonses being withdrawn. The company paid the money.

INQUESTS. CORONER'S REPORTS.

1. William John Joscelyne. Ex Policeman. He was "accidentally killed" at age 36 on 21. 6. 1843, two months before his last son William John Joscelyne was born. He had reverted to Labourer. It was a coroner's verdict without inquest 1843. Death certificate held.

"MELANCHOLY AND FATAL ACCIDENT"

On Friday last, a jury of the inhabitants of Springfield was impanelled before C. C. Lewis Esq. at The Three Cups Inn, on view of the body of William Joslin, aged 36 years, who met with his death on the previous Wednesday evening, from the injuries he sustained in consequence of a large timber tree falling upon him. The body of the unfortunate deceased presented a dreadful spectacle – the right thigh as far as the hip being literally crushed to pieces and the bed on which he lay saturated with his blood- Samuel Newton being examined, deposed that on Wednesday evening, between 7 and 8 o'clock, he was employed with the deceased and several others in loading a barge with heavy timber trees from Messrs. Pigott and Son's wharf, at Springfield; deceased was conducting the tree, (which had been raised by the crane several feet from the ground) into the barge, when the chain round the timber suddenly broke, and the timber fell upon deceased's right thigh. He was extricated in the course of two or three minutes, and was, by direction of Mr. J. B. Gray, (who attended shortly after the accident,) conveyed to his house, on Springfield – hill, in a state of dreadful suffering. He died about 11 o'clock the same night. A juryman asked the witness whether he considered the chain which was round the timber of sufficient strength to bear so great a weight. He replied that he was doubtful of it before it was used; but it had never been tested by trees of such weight. They were loading English timber which had been purchased by the government. He recollected the crane chain breaking on several occasions. Another juryman said he had inspected the chain since the accident and considered it by no means a proper one for such heavy work. The coroner remarked to witness that it was great pity he did not mention his doubts before the chain was used. A juryman enquired the reason for the timber being raised so high from the ground, which increased the danger; when it was explained that the wharf was so obstructed by a quantity of railway materials that the timber had to be raised over them previously to its being lowered into the barge. Witness stated that the chain bore the weight of the tree in the first instance, but it had to be brought back in consequence of the position in which it was placed on the barge, and on the second occasion it broke. A juryman remarked that if the obstruction on the wharf caused danger to the workmen, he was surprised the Navigation Company allowed it to remain. Another witness who was at work at the crane and witnessed the accident, gave a similar statement relating to the melancholy occurrence; and the jury returned a verdict of "Accidental death". The deceased was principally employed by Messrs Wells and Perry, and has left a wife and four small children.

Editor's Comment. This is the report on William Joscelyne, great great grandfather of C. A. Snodgrass. There are NO coroner's reports at the ERO.

Before becoming employed on the wharf, William Joscelyne joined the Essex Police Force on 18.3.1840 and lived at Witham with his wife and three children, Hephzibah, Elizabeth Catherine and Thomas Alfred Joscelyne, having moved from Springfield. Anne Hart Joscelyne (editor's great grandmother) was born in Witham. In 1842 William was dismissed from the police force. No reason was stated despite reasons being given for the numerous other dismissals. The family returned to Springfield. William was killed on 21.6.1843 and his son William John was born posthumously on 31.8.1843. William's wife, Elizabeth Sh(e)arman, baptised in Staines, Middx. in 1804, subsequently married George Elles, a carpenter, the ceremony taking place in St. Mary's, Whitechapel on 7.1.1849. She died of a "paralytic fit" back in Springfield on 13.7.1859. Anne Hart Joscelyne did not remember her father. She had 3 children and died aged 87 years. Thomas Alfred committed suicide on 30th November 1887 aged 51 years. (See Inquest 2) He had no children. William John died of typhoid fever on 22nd November 1879 aged 36 years leaving 8 children.

2. Thomas Alfred Joscelyne, trained as a baker and confectioner and was born in 1836, a son of William Joscelyne reported above. His death certificate appears under Joclyne although his In Memorium Card circulated to family and friends names him correctly as Joscelyne and confirms burial in Tooting Cemetery. A report in The Mid-Surrey Gazette of Saturday, December 10th 1887 reads as follows.

SUICIDE IN BATTERSEA PARK. – At The Star and Garter, Church-road, on Friday. Mr. A. Braxton Hicks held an inquest concerning the death of Thomas Alfred Joclyne, aged 51, a carpenter, lately residing at 33, Renfrew-road, Kennington-lane, who was found shot in Battersea Park, on Wednesday last. – Annie Joclyne, the widow, said that her husband had been out of employment about 12 months, but that they had money which they had saved. They had no children. He had been suffering mentally for some time; but beyond occasionally expressing a wish that he was out of this world, he had never given her any reason to suppose that he would commit suicide. – William Harrison, one of the park keepers, deposed that about half past four on Wednesday afternoon, he was standing near the south-west gate when he heard the report of firearms and found deceased lying on the path, near a seat, with the revolver (produced) grasped in his right hand. The weapon was a six-chambered one, but it had been loaded in only one chamber. The unfortunate man was quite dead, and his body was removed to the mortuary. A wound was afterwards discovered on the right side of his head. The bullet had traversed the brain and lodged in the skull. Death must have been instantaneous. The jury returned a verdict of temporary insanity.

Editor's Comment. This verdict was not broadcast down to my mother's generation. He was supposed to have died in an accident falling off scaffolding. He was brother to my mother's grandmother and was recorded as a baker in Tonbridge, Kent by my mother. It is uncertain whether a mental illness contributed to his unemployment or was the result of it. A change of occupation and home is unexplained.

3. Jeremiah Orris was found dead on 18.9.1851 at Springfield, Chelmsford. He was the father of Kezia Orris who was the wife of John Woodward Joscelyne of Leigh on Sea. An inquest was held on 30.9.1851. The verdict and the curious and unnecessarily upsetting report in the Essex Herald of Tuesday Sept. 23rd 1851 (col. 7, p.4.) could hardly be thought to be reassuring to the relatives. The report reads as follows.

SUDDEN DEATH. – On Wednesday last very sudden death occurred to a man named Jeremiah Orris, clerk at Mr. Jones' coal-wharf, Springfield. It appear that on Tuesday night he retired to rest in much better spirits, and on the following morning, when his wife went to call him she discovered him to be a corpse; life seemed to have passed away, for he was lying in his usual posture of repose. Deceased had been subject to shortness of breath for a long time, but on Tuesday was better than usual. He was 69 of years of age and bore an irreproachable character. – On Friday an inquest was held at the two Brewers, public house, before C. C. Lewis, Esq., coroner, when the evidence went to show that deceased had been afflicted with a severe asthmatical condition for several years. Verdict "Found Dead".

Editorial Comment. His "shortness of breath" could have been cardiac in origin or the result of industrial illness due to inhalation of coal or other dusts.

CONVICTS.

Editor's Comment. I have not searched for the crime yet.

In Dorothy Gardner's book, she quotes a **day labourers wage** as 10d to 1s 0d in the early 18th C.

An interesting entry in the Burials register in 1718 states: "Buried in Linen and paid ye penalty of ye Act". Dorothy Gardner says this relates to an Act of 1667, together with another in 1678, which required burials to be in exclusively **woollen shrouds** intended to benefit the wool trade. If no Affidavit was made, the fine was £5.
