INTRODUCTION

On the chart "Pedigree of Joscelyne 1500-1900 AD in England" by W. F. & A. W. Joscelyne " sheet 3, Hugh Josselyn of Mount Bures appears and he died in 1765.

This information was a starting point for Bea Byrne to link in her ancestors.

Mount Bures

The village of Mount Bures stands back from the road. The "mount" is the large motte of a Norman Castle, and a cruciform Norman church, St. John, was built under its shadow. Much Roman brick was re-used in the fabric and can still be seen, particularly round the windows in the west wall.

Generation No 1:

Hugh Josselyn was the son of James Josselyn and Rose, daughter of Hugh Rice and was baptised 22 December 1691 at St. Peter and St. Paul, Little Horkesley. He married Mary Unknown. Licence 4 December 1739 Mount Bures. Hugh Josselyn aged 20 years and Mary Porter aged 30 years, single, to be married in Markshall, Essex. Duty was £200 to the Bishop. Is this Hugh and Mary, as the ages and church do not fit? They had six children Hugh, Mary, James, John, Mark and Sarah.

He died in 1766 at Mount Bures. Will proven June 1766 names wife Mary, daughters Mary and Sarah, sons Hugh and John.

Mary Josselyn was buried 4 August 1765 at Mount Bures.

Children of Hugh and Mary Josselyn:

- i. Hugh Josselyn baptised at Saint John, Mount Bures on 24 September 1741.
- ii. Mary Josselyn baptised on 30 March 1743.
- iii. James Josselyn baptised 25 May 1745 but died and was buried in 1746.
- iv. John Josselyn baptised 1746 and bequeathed property at Mount Bures, Wakes Colne and Chappell
- v. Mark Josselyn baptised March 1748/1749 and was not mentioned in father's Will
- vi. Sarah Josselyn baptised 18 March 1748/1749. She married Henry Dunnage of the parish of Langham, miller, by licence issued 21 December 1779.

Generation No 2:

Hugh Josselyn was baptised 24 September 1741 at St. John Church. His marriage licence was dated 5 December 1763 and it states that Hugh was 22 and a farmer and Susan Elsden was 21. Her father Thomas Elsden was also a farmer and came from Lexden, near Colchester, Essex. Hugh and Susan had five children. Hugh had another nine children, their mother was Mary Hammond, Hugh's housekeeper. There is no trace of Susan. Did she run away? Also, there is no record of Hugh ever marrying Mary Hammond, but on some documents she is referred to as Mary Josselyn wife of Hugh. Hugh died 1809 and was buried on 23 October 1809 at St. John, Mount Bures. In his will it says: I give and bequeath to my several children or reputed children Mark Josselyn otherwise Hammond, Rose and Charlotte Josselyn otherwise Hammond, the children of Mary Hammond my housekeeper the sum of five hundred pounds each...."

Children of Hugh and Susan Josselyn:

- i. Susannah Josselyn married Thos. Taylor, single man of the parish of Little Dunmow married by license 12 July 1791 at St. John, Mount Bures. The couple had four children, but Susannah died before 1809. In the Will of Hugh Josselyn dated 1809, names son-in-law, Thomas Taylor of Dovercourt and four children of late daughter Susannah £500.
- Thomas Josselyn baptised 13 September 1765 privately and buried 20 September 1765 at Mount Bures.
- Mary Josselyn married Joseph Page of Fingringhoe on 23 April 1795 by licence at St. John Church. The Will of 1809, daughter Mary Page, widow, £500.
- iv. Hugh Josselyn baptised 20 May 1768 son of Hugh and Susan Josselyn.

 Thomas Josselyn baptised October 1772 son of Hugh and Susan Josselyn. Buried 26 May 1777 in the churchyard of St. John, Mount Bures.

Children or reputed children of Hugh Josselyn and Mary Hammond:

 Ann Josselyn married Arthur Allen 27 November 1807 at St. Dionis Backchurch, London. (Source: Guildhall, London).

MS 17605/1 Entry 401

Arthur Allen of this parish a bachelor and Ann Josselyn of the Parish of Mount Bures in the County of Essex a spinster were married in the Church by licence this 27 November 1807. By me Geo Williams, Curate. This marriage was solemnised in the presence of John Josselyn and Robert Osmond.

Ann is referred in her father's will, as the wife of Arthur Allen, of the Ordinance Office at the Tower of London and he left £500 to her and her children.

Sarah Josselyn married Samuel Ratcliff of Sandon, 8 July 1801, by licence. In her father's will, "daughter or reputed daughter, the now wife of Samuel Ratcliff of Toppesfield, farmer £500."
 MI. East Hanningfield. Samuel Ratcliff, late of Gibcrack Farm in hamlet of Purleigh, died on 2 January 1842, aged 64.

1851 census East Hanningfield Sarah Ratcliff, Head, widow aged 72, farmer 100 acres employing six labourers. Born in Ramsey, Essex. James Ratcliff, son aged 42, farmer and partner. Born in Toppesfield.

Sarah was buried 9 June 1855 aged 77. MI of East Hanningfield only partly legible.

iii. Mary Josselyn married John Josselyn of Great Oakley, on 22 January 1801. In her father's will she was left £500. John Josselyn was buried on 17 May 1833 aged 54. Mary Josselyn was buried 8th March 1857 at Great Oakley, but she was from Colchester aged 77.

iv. Hugh Josselyn b c 1784

In the will of his father he is left all messages or tenement and farm called Well House Farm with the lands etc. belonging in the several parishes of Mounts Bures and Wormingford. If Hugh died without issue to go to James (his brother) if both died, then to children Mary Page, Sarah, Mary, Ann, Elizabeth, Mark, Rose and Charlotte, share and share alike.

The Mount Bures parish registers here are puzzling. Why did Hugh sign the marriage license "Hugh Josselyn Hamet"?

Marriage 12 January 1812, **Hugh Josselyn** <u>Hamet</u> of this parish, bachelor, and **Deborah Pettit** of this parish, spinster, by licence. Baptism 10 June 1812, Charles Josselyn <u>Hamet</u>, son of Hugh Josselyn and Deborah <u>Hamet</u>.

The curate, Wm. Plume, who officiated at the marriage of Hugh and Deborah, and the baptism of Charles, first appears in the Mt. Bures register in December 1811. Did Hugh say Hammond and the curate heard Hamet?

(Note: I think Hamet is referring to the Hamlet of Mount Bures, as it appears on other entries in the parish records. Brenda)

Robert Josselyn aged 24, occupation farmer of 95 acres employing 4 labourers, born Mount Bures, Essex.

Mark Josselyn aged 58, brother, annuitant, unmarried, born Mount Bures, Essex.

Hugh was buried on 6 July 1853 in the churchyard of St. John, Mount Bures.

Deborah died 3 April 1862 and was buried 10 April 1862 in the churchyard of St. John. Source: Essex Record Office.

- v. James Josselyn In his father's will James was left £500, also newly erected message or tenement in Mount Bures with the windmill near thereto and all the going gears, flour sacks and implements used in and about the said mill, with the ground, yards and appurtenances to the said messuage and mill belonging and appertaining and also the piece or parcel of pasture and the hop ground being at the bottom of Hill Field in which the said mill stands and also one acre of meadow in Long Meadow in the parish of Wormingford.
- vi. Elizabeth Josselyn In her father's will she was left £500, daughter or reputed daughter wife of Francis Josselyn of Wix, miller. Francis died September 1844 at Dovercourt and was buried 23 September 1844 aged 60 in the churchyard of St. John.
 1851 Census Elizabeth Josselyn, aged 60 and she were a widow, living at Dovercourt, Essex and born in Ramsey, Essex. Also Henrietta Pratt, granddaughter
- vii. Mark Josselyn Born about 1792 at Mount Bures. He was left £500 in the will of his father. He died in March 1865 aged 73 and was buried 24 March 1865

aged 10.

in the churchyard of St. John.

- 1851 Census Mark Josselyn, aged 58, he was unmarried, living with brother, Hugh. 1861 Census Mark Josselyn, aged 71, he was unmarried living with Deborah Josselyn and Robert Josselyn.
- viii. Rose Josselyn Born about 1794 at Mount Bures. Her father left her £500 in 1809. Rose married King Viall of Bulmer by licence with consent of parents on 10 March 1813 at Great Henny and the witnesses were Samuel Viall and Charlotte Josselyn.

Licence: ERO D/ALL 1813 "Mary Josselyn widow of the late Hugh Josselyn, natural and lawful mother of the aforesaid Rose". Signed: X Mary Josselyn. Both were underage.

Rose married well, living at Baythorn Park, Birdbrook, Essex. It is a mansion house, set in 500 acres, which were sold piecemeal in the 1920s and 1930s, but which the present owner, Mr. Julian Watson, is buying back. When he took over, he sold "all that armour" because he did not like it.

1851 Census aged 57 living at Stoke by Clare, Suffolk

1871 Census aged 79 living at Baythorne Park, Birdbrook with King Viall aged 79, landowner, farmer of 160 acres. Also Rose Comell aged 27, granddaughter, plus three servants and one nurse.

Rose died 19 October 1871, aged 77, at Baythome Park, apoplexy, paralysis, debility. Certificate. Buried at St. Leonard's, Wixoe, Suffolk.

MI "Rose the wife of King Viall who departed this life October 19th 1871 in the 78th year of her age".

King Viall died in 1872 aged 78.

ix. Charlotte Josselyn Baptised privately 17 October 1796 Mount Bures. Her father left Charlotte £500. On 19 March 1815 at St. John she married David Stinson of St. Martin's, Colchester. David was a tailor.

The couple had two children:

- i. David Stinson, baptised 23 September 1816 at St. John, Mount Bures.
- ii. Hugh Josselyn Stinson, baptised 16 October 1819 at St. John, Mount Bures.

Generation No. 3

Hugh Josselyn married Deborah Grove Pettit 12 January 1812 St. John, Mount Bures.

Children of Hugh Josselvn and Deborah Grove Pettit:

Charles Josselyn Baptised 10 June 1812 in Mount Bures, Essex. Died 2 February i. 1872 Stanway, Essex. Married Elizabeth Sidney 1855. She was born abt. 1820 in Toppesfield and died 19 February 1887 in Bow Cottage, Lexden Heath, Colchester.

ii. Robert Josselyn Baptised 10 June 1826 in Mount Bures, Essex. Death reference 1886, of Bures Hamlet, Essex. Cattle Dealer died 12 January 1886 Bures St. Mary's, to Deborah Payne (sister) wife of Henry Payne, Birdbrook Moat Birdbrook, Essex.

Census 1851 HO 107 1782 580 page 2 Well House, Mount Bures. Robert Josselyn aged 24, occupation farmer of 95 acres employing four labourers.

White's Directory of Essex, 1848. Mount Bures Robert Josselyn, farmer.

Census 1881 RG11 1826 65 page 14. "The Eight Bells Inn" Bures St. Mary, Essex. Robert Josselyn aged 54 unmarried, lodger, retired farmer.

iii. Deborah Pettit Josselyn Baptised 22 March 1831 in Mount Bures, Essex. Married Henry Payne in 1848.

Census 1881 RG11 1824 19 page 7. Living Meat Farm, Birdbrook, Essex. Henry Payne aged 64 Farmer of 1418 acres, employing 60 men and 33 boys. He was born in Wix, Suffolk.

Deborah Payne aged 50 farmers wife born Mount Bures, Essex.

They had a housemaid and a cook.

1885 White's Directory of Suffolk: Stoke-by-Clare, "all the parish is freehold, except a small farm belonging to Mr. Payne, which is copyhold". Henry Payne a farmer, his home Birdbrook, Essex.

Rose Josselyn married King Viall 10 March 1813 at St. Mary, Great Henny, Essex.

Children of Rose Josselyn and King Viall:

Charlotte Viall was baptised 23 July 1815 at Stoke by Clare, Suffolk.
 Charlotte married William Payne, farmer of Steeple Bumpstead on 26 April 1838 at Stoke by Clare. Certificate.
 William died, aged 31, in 1844 of consumption. Certificate
 Charlotte died 24 July 1848, aged 35, at Steeple Bumpstead, of "cancerous affeaction" [sic]. Certificate

The couple had three children:

- Charlotte Elizabeth Payne baptised 26 May 1840, at Steeple Bumpstead.
- ii. William King Viall Payne baptised 18 October 1842, at Steeple Bumpstead.
- iii. Fanny Mary Payne baptised 6 July 1844, at Steeple Bumpstead.

William King Vial Payne died 21 February 1844, of water on the brain. Certificate. 1851 the sisters, then aged 10 and 6, were at school at Clare.

Fanny Mary died aged 20 on 5 June 1864, at The Cedars, Clapham, Surrey. The inquest returned a verdict of "poisoned by drinking some disinfectant fluid by mistake". Certificate

The remaining sister, generally known as Elizabeth (ref sale catalogue of part of Baythome Park property) in 1881 was 40, at 61 Ladbroke Grove Road, Kensington (parish of St. Marks), "annuitant".

She was the only surviving heir of her father, who was the heir of his father and joint heir with her Aunt Matilda of the estate of her uncle, John Quye. Also King Viall in his Will established a trust fund for her of £1,000.

1901 29 Lyndewode Road, (parish of St. Paul's), Cambridge, Charlotte E. Payne unmarried aged 60 and living on her own means, with a lady's help and a domestic servant.

She died on 30 December 1912 (Death Duty Register, William Payne, Steeple Bumpstead).

ii. John Quye Viall Baptised 23 July 1815, Stoke by Clare, Suffolk.

1851 aged 35 living at Stoke by Clare, Suffolk.

1861 aged 47 living at Baythome Park, Birdbrook, a boarder, and

1861 aged 47 living at Baythome Park, Birdbrook, a boarder, and farmer's son. He died 22 June 1870 at Baythorne End, Birdbrook aged 54 of dyspepsia, debility. Certificate.

Buried St. Leonard's Wixoe, Suffolk. MI "Died 22 January 1870 in 56th year".

1867 will of King Viall:

I direct my executors to pay the .. fines and fees .. which may be payable or incurred in respect of the admittance of my son John Quye Viall to certain copyhold hereditaments in .. Tilbury and Ashden .. to which he will become entitled .. at my death under the Will of his great unde John Quye deceased. Whereas I some years ago purchased a blacksmiths shop and cottage and a wheelwrights shop and cottage respectively situated at Stoke next Clare .. and my said son ... was admitted tenant

thereof .. now I do declare that my said son and their heirs shall from and after my decease stand seized and possessed of the said copyhold hereditaments. And I do regard to his condition of mind and the income to which he will become entitled in his own right at my death I do not think it useful or likely to be conducive to his benefit to make any further provision for him.

Louisa Viall Baptised 26 May 1817, Stoke by Clare, Suffolk.
 1851 aged 34 living at Stoke by Clare.

Died 30 March 1853 aged 35, erysipelas of leg, at Angel Hill, Bury St. Edmunds. Certificate.

Buried at St. Leonard's Wixoe, Suffolk

Memorial window in church of St. John the Baptist, Stoke by Clare "In memory of Louisa Viall of this parish who died 30 March 1853 in the 36th year of her age. Erected 1886".

Matilda Viall Baptised 22 May 1820 Stoke by Clare.
 Married 26 November 1840, Joseph Cornell, farmer of Wethersfield, at Stoke by Clare Parish Church. Certificate.

1841 they are living at Summers Hall, Baythorn End. Joseph Cornell aged 28, farmer Matilda Cornell aged 20 Four servants

1851 living at Summers Hall.

Joseph Cornell aged 39, farmer of 800 acres, employing 40 men

Matilda Comell aged 31, farmer's wife.

They had two house servants and one groom.

1861 living at Summers Hall.

Joseph Cornell aged 48, farmer of 800 acres, employing 40 men and 20 boys.

Matilda Cornell aged 41 plus seven children from Louisa aged 19 to Ellen aged 2.

1871 living at Chapple Street, Stoke by Clare, Suffolk.

Joseph Cornell aged 58, farmer employing 56 men and 20 boys

Matilda Cornell aged 50.

Joseph John Quye Cornell aged 17.

There is also a cook and general servant.

1881 Baythome Park, Birdbrook,

Joseph Cornell aged 68, farmer of 500 acres, employing 16 men and 6 boys.

Matilda Cornell aged 60

James V. C. Farquhar aged 3 grandson visiting.

There are three servants.

Joseph died 3 October 1886, aged 75, at Wood Street, Walthamstow of diphtheria and congestion of the lungs. *Certificate*.

Matilda died 25 October 1894 aged 75 of old age and asthenia. Certificate.

Matilda Viall married Joseph Cornell 26 November 1840 at Stoke by Clare Parish Church.

Children of Matilda Viall and Joseph Cornell:

Louisa Matilda Cornell born 28 September 1841 at Wetherfield. Certificate.
 Baptised 25 October 1841, St. Mary Magdalene, Wethersfield.
 1851 aged 8 at school in Finchingfield.

Married James Scrudy, farmer on 17 May 1866 at St. Saviours, Southwark. Certificate.

They had nine children: James Ernest, William Howard, Edward Charles, Henrietta Edith, Emily Marian, Rose, Basil, Florence and Cecil.

In 1881 they were living at Harlow.

James Scrudy aged 39, Louisa Matilda aged 39 plus five children.

In 1901 they were living in Rye Street, Bishops Stortford (St. Michael's parish) – Louisa M. Scrudy aged 59, with two children, a cook and Housemaid. James was away visiting in Kent.

King Viall will £4000 trust fund.

ii. Rose Cornell born 11 March 1844 at Summers Hall, Wethersfield Certificate.
 Baptised 25 March 1844 St. Mary Magdalene, Wethersfield.
 1851 aged 8 at school in Finchingfield.
 1861 aged 17 at home, Summers Hall, Wethersfield.
 1871 aged 27 at Baythorne Park in Birdbrook, with grandparents.

Married John Henry Farquhar, clerk in Holy Orders on 8 September 1875 at Stoke by Clare. Certificate.

Known children:

- Matilda Louisa R. Farquhar born 1876 Raglan, Monmouth, 1881 census she was 5 years old. In 1901 census she was Louisa aged 24 living with her parents in Silvington, Salop.
- James Vaux Cornell Farquhar: born about 1877. He was rector of Hexham, Durham 1919-1944.
 1881 census James V. C. Farquhar aged 3, was visiting his grandparents, Joseph and Matilda Cornell at Park House, Birdbrook, Essex.

In 1901 census John was 54 Clergyman of Church of England and Rose was 57 and they were living in Silvington, Salop.

1881 census RG11 0918 25 page 23 Riverdale, Dry Hill Park, Tonbridge, Kent. Charles George Clapham was aged 42, occupation Member of London Stock Exchange (Broker). Francis Eliza aged 35 with four children, cook, housemaid, nurse and nursemaid.

Francis Eliza Clapham died 22 August 1887 aged 41, at Tooting, of tubercular disease of lungs and intestines. *Certificate*.

Married Joseph Frederick Halls, farmer of Walton, Norfolk, on 27 May 1875 at Stoke by Clare. Certificate.

Alumni Cantab.: Adm. Pens (age 20) at Pembroke, 26 June 1869, son and heir of Joseph of Stoke, Suffolk, husbandman, born at Wethersfield, school Felstead, Matric. Mich. 1869.

1871 at Summers Hall, Wethersfield, farmer of 250 acres, employing 11 men and 6 boys.

Married Jessie Florence Barnard, a second cousin, 7 October 1880 at Stoke by Clare. Officiating Minister Rev. Thomas V. Cornell (brother). Certificate.

1881 at Summers Hall, King Viall Cornell aged 31, farmer of 250 acres employing 12 labourers and 2 boys. Jessie aged 24 also a general servant and a dairymaid.

I devise the small piece of land or my share or interest in the small piece of land recently purchased by me at Chelmsford or Springfield, Essex, his heirs and assigns absolutely, I devise all those my farms respectively called Bowles and the Causeway, which are respectively situate in the parishes of Birdbrook and Ridgewell, Essex and are now in the occupation of my son-in-law Joseph Cornell, and also all and singular my tithe rent charge arising out of such lands situated in the parish of Stoke next Clare, Suffolk, as are now in the occupation of my son-in-law Joseph Cornell.

The Mansion House at Baythorn Park, to permit my wife personally to reside. Then Matilda and Joseph Cornell, then Thomas Pratt Cornell, John Quye Cornell, then any other sons of Joseph and Matilda, then the daughters in order of seniority, and finally King Viall Cornell, with children of each entitled to follow that person.

The name King Viall – in case any one of my grandsons except King Viall Comell shall become entitled in possession to the said hereditaments, then it is my will and desire that such Grandson forthwith take and at all times thereafter and use my names of King Viall.

No reason is stated for the exclusion of the oldest grandson.

Will of King Viall:

While he is under 25, until the £8000 trust fund be raised, to raise out of the rents and profits, an annual sum of £320 to pay or apply the same for the maintenance, education or otherwise, particularly in or towards maintaining at such one of the universities of Oxford or Cambridge, as they (the trustees) shall select with a view to his being brought up to the profession of a clergyman of the established Church of England. To purchase a living and if he dies before 25 or by death of Thomas becomes the eldest son exclusive of King Viall, then he gets the trust fund, which was reduced by codicil to £4000. The obligation to take my said name shall be postponed until by virtue of this my will he be entitled to the actual possession of the rents and profits.

He did not become a clergyman, but a stockbroker.

Mary Ann Osborn said she was a bridesmaid at the wedding of Henry and Fanny on 1st December 1849 in the parish of Dovercourt, Essex.

The Lord Mayor said "I have reason to believe that you have more wives".

The Prisoner, "More! No; two are quite enough for one man. The Lord Mayor said "O Well I shall commit you for trial". The Prisoner laughing, I thank you your lordship.

1851 Census Elizabeth Josselyn, aged 60 and she were a widow, living at Dovercourt, Essex and born in Ramsey, Essex. Also Henrietta Pratt, granddaughter aged 10. Elizabeth died 1876 and is buried All Saints, Dovercourt.

Children of Francis and Elizabeth:

- John Josselyn christened 30 July 1809 Saint Mary, Wix.
- Charles Josselyn christened 10 March 1813 Saint Mary, Wix. He married Elizabeth Smith, daughter of Samuel Smith, on 18 September 1842 at All Saints, Dovercourt.
